## The Epiphany in other countries

In some countries the celebration of the Epiphany is more important than the celebration of Christmas. In Spain, for example, it is the three wise men who bring the Christmas gifts. Often towns and villages will have a procession through the streets. It is a great honour to be chosen to play the part of one of the wise men. The word, Epiphany, means "showing". When the shepherds saw the baby Jesus he was revealed to the Jewish people, but the coming of the Magi signifies Jesus being revealed to the world. From his very birth, Jesus is shown as the Saviour of the whole world.
