The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

After Emperor Constantine was converted to Christianity in 312 His mother Helen travelled to the Holy Land to visit the holy sites of the events of the life of Jesus. Between 326 and 328 she made a pilgrimage to Palestine. She identified the site of Jesus' birth and his ascension and ordered churches to be built on these spots.

According to legend Helen ordered the destruction of a pagan temple that had been built on Calvary. Excavations discovered three crosses on the spot. To find out which was the true cross Helen ordered a sick woman, on the point of death, to be brought. After touching the first and the second cross her condition did not change but when she touched the third, she was cured immediately. This cross was deemed to be the True Cross and was taken to Constantinople.

Many churches claim to have a fragment of the True Cross, but it is impossible to trace their provenance back to the cross discovered by St Helen.

We celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross on 14th September, which is why this year the feast replaces the celebration of a Sunday in Ordinary Time. The 14th September is both the anniversary of Helen finding the cross and also the anniversary of the dedication of the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre built over the spot.

The conversion of the Emperor Constantine marked the end of the persecution of the Christian faith, as Christianity became the state religion of the Roman Empire. Even after the collapse of the Empire, Christianity continued to flourish in Europe and beyond.
