

# In gratitude to Pope Francis A brief biography

1936: Born Jorge Bergoglio in Argentina Son of Italian immigrants

1954: High School studies in Chemistry1955: Worked in a laboratory, as a labourer and as a bouncer!

1957: Had part of his lung removed

1958: Joined the Jesuits after his recovery

1969: Ordained a Catholic priest

1973: Became the provincial of Argentina
As provincial he tried to protect Jesuits
from persecution by the Junta

1979: Spent time in Dublin

1980: Rector of the seminary in Buenos Aires1992: Became auxiliary bishop of Buenos Aires

1998: Became archbishop of Buenos Aires

2001: Created Cardinal by John Paul II

2013: Elected pope by the conclave
He chose the name "Francis" after St
Francis of Assisi

2025: Died in Rome.

May he rest in peace!

As pope, Francis defended the poor and migrants. He wrote passionately about the environment. He called a Universal Synod of the Catholic Church so that everyone could have a say. He visited 68 different countries including Ireland, but sadly. he did not visit England or his native Argentina.

#### **The Conclave**

The Cardinals of the Catholic Church will gather in conclave to listen to the Holy Spirit and choose a new successor to St Peter. We have 5 Cardinals from Britain who will take part in this process:

**Cardinal Vincent Nichols** 

Cardinal Timothy Radcliffe OP

Cardinal Michael Fitzgerald MAfr

Cardinal Arthur Roach

Cardinal Sean Brady (Armagh) is 86 so he can attend but is not able to vote.

Three of the four English cardinal electors have visited Stonyhurst in the past. We can pray for them as they decide who to vote for in the conclave. Watch for the white smoke!
